#### **Rural Hepburn Strategic Framework**

The draft Rural Hepburn strategy designates two rural Policy Areas to respond to the diversity of the Shire's rural areas. This allows planning responses to be tailored to achieve desired future outcomes.

**Policy Area 1 Our Agricultural Engine Area**: Policy Area 1 includes our most strategic and productive agricultural land. Supporting the continued operation and viability of commercial scale agricultural enterprises is the highest priority. New dwellings and subdivisions are supported where direct and legitimate agricultural benefits can be demonstrated. Non-agricultural uses, such as tourism, are strongly discouraged.

**Policy Area 2 Mixed Rural Activity Area:** Policy Area 2's agricultural land productivity is varied and relates to land where there is existing development including housing and tourism. There are opportunities to apply the Rural Activity Zone providing flexibility for farming and other land uses to co-exist. New rural uses will need to demonstrate a link with agriculture or an environmental benefit. You can find out more information about the Policy Areas in Section 2: Strategic Framework (page 22-26).
